



Pastor's Column

Thanks to all who took part in or helped in any way with the Marian Mass, Procession, and Rosary Rally at the Court House last Saturday. It was a very, very beautiful event in honor of Our Lady. When our Evangelization and Youth Coordinator, Chris Hiles, had told me a number of months ago that he had acquired a permit to hold a Rosary Rally on the Court House steps, I thought he was crazy. I'm glad I didn't let that thought stop me from giving him the green light. So many have commented on what a spiritually uplifting event it was and how meaningful to bring Our Lady's Presence right to the center of our community and pray for it and for our country and our Church.

It was also neat to hear how many of you made the 33-days preparation for consecration and made your consecration to Jesus through Mary at the Court House, in the public square. I also found it inspiring to see so many wearing their St. Peter T-shirts letting everyone know who we are, and that we are and intend to be fully, a Community Founded on Adoration and Presence to the Poor!

On another note, as mentioned last week we have not been successful in acquiring appropriate new side chalices that would address our spillage problems. We are now using the existing side chalices with less wine than before with the hopes that this will at least temporarily fix the problem. So please remember to be very careful with these side chalices if you receive from them.

Also, a reminder to all who distribute Communion, whether at church or to the homebound, that Deacon Hauser will be conducting an updating of procedures meeting. This meeting is required for all who distribute Communion-more information about that is elsewhere in this bulletin.

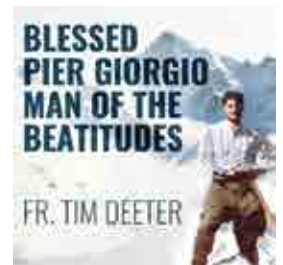

Born in 1901 in Turin, Italy into a family of wealth and status, Pier Giorgio enjoyed good friends, hiking and skiing, museums and music, and was involved in political action. He found that deep prayer, service to the poor, and a passion for bringing others to Christ led to a life of purpose, peace, and happiness. Pier Giorgio died at the age of 24 on July 4, 1925. 

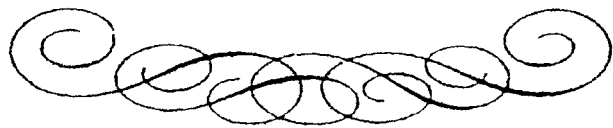
