#### FROM THE PASTOR'S DESK



This weekend at the 11:30 Mass we will be having a Baptism and Confirmation of a catechumen and candidate who have completed their preparations and will be received into the Church. Both went through the RCIA in previous years. We are excited that they are now in a position to be able to enter in fully to the sacraments of the Church. Mr. Wes Thompson will be baptized, confirmed and receive his First Holy Eucharist. Mr. Mike Gumm, having already been baptized in a Protestant denomination, will make a Profession of Faith, be confirmed, and receive his First Holy Eucharist. On Gaudate Sunday (Rejoice Sunday) we have an extra reason to rejoice – rejoicing at the approach of Our Lord's Birth at Christmas as well as rejoicing that these two men will now be able to receive Him fully, Body, Blood, Soul, and Divinity, in the Holy Eucharist. Please pray for these new members plus the 15+ others who are presently in various stages of preparing to enter the Church in our parish. God is blessing us with a large number of people seeking Him more fully in the life of His Church.

Also, during my sermon on the fourth of the cardinal virtues, Temperance, I referred to a program of asceticism that helps lead people into freedom. As I mentioned this program was originally developed to help men who are fighting pornography addiction but has quickly become used for many other battles with our fallen nature (like anger, gluttony, excessive drinking, media addiction, etc.). 


